

The 17th annual LA Harbor International Film Festival (LAHIFF), a non-competitive, non-juried film festival will take place Thursday, March 12 through Sunday, March 15 at the vintage Art Deco Warner Grand Theatre, 478 W. 6th Street in Historic Downtown San Pedro.

This year's theme is inspired by the festival's free education outreach program "Read the Book, See the Movie" selection *The Secret Garden* by Frances Hodgson Burnett. Read the Book, See the Movie distributes free books to area students, who read and discuss it over several weeks then attend a culmination program at the Warner Grand Theatre to see the movie based on the book.

LOS ANGELES WORLD CRUISE TERMINAL—Most cruises from San Pedro sail from the World Cruise Terminal. (Occasionally cruises will dock at Berth 43 at the Outer Harbor.)

Whether parking or dropping off or picking up passengers, enter the Cruise Terminal on Swinford Street and follow the signs for the appropriate berth or to enter the parking lot. You can drop off passengers and luggage at the lower levels and return to the parking lot to leave your vehicle

There is plenty of parking for passengers who drive in to their embarkation. The first hour is free and \$2 thereafter, up to a maximum of \$18 per day for standard vehicles.

Or you can choose one of the park-and-cruise packages available at one of our recommended hotels. These hotels offer accommodation, parking, and transportation directly to and from the World Cruise Terminal for guests. We recommend the DoubleTree by Hilton San Pedro-Port of Los Angeles Hotel, Best Western Plus San Pedro Hotel & Suites, the Vagabond Inn, and Terranea Resort.

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


Rare Books & Framing, Too

Find your way around San Pedro—and all of LA.

There are lots of ways to get around.

The Historic Downtown is within walking distance of the San Pedro Waterfront or you can take the trolley on weekends.

The Downtown Trolley operates on weekends between the Cruise Terminal, 6th and 7th Streets, and Pacific Avenue, CRAFTED at the Port of Los Angeles, SS Lane Victory, and a stop at Battleship Iowa.

DASH buses operate on routes throughout the greater San Pedro area, south as far as 25th Street and west to Western Avenue.

Commuter Express line 142 has direct service to the Downtown Long Beach Transit Gallery where you can catch the Blue Line train that travels to downtown Los Angeles and connects to most rail lines that run throughout the greater Los Angeles area. Catch it at on the Waterfront or at stops along 7th Street and Gaffey Street north of 7th Street. (Note: the Blue Line is undergoing reconstruction and stops at the Rosa Parks Station. Buses are available to continue its route to Downtown Los Angeles.

Metro Transit buses operate several lines into, out of, and around San Pedro, mainly along 7th Street, Pacific Avenue, and Gaffey Street (although other streets are also served).

Connections to **Metrorail** are available from Downtown Los Angeles's Metro Center and some buses stop at rail stations along their routes.

The **Palos Verdes Transit Authority** provides bus services around the Palos Verdes Peninsula, to San Pedro, and as far north and west as Redondo Beach
