### **Whale Watching**

Whale watching season kicked off at the end of December and continues through the middle of April.

Cabrillo Marine Aquarium offers whale watching voyages from a number of ports with naturalists on board to explain about the big mammals, mostly California gray whales, and how they migrate between arctic waters and a gulf in Mexico every year. It's thrilling to see the animals breach or even just swim by.

And there were sitings off Pt. Vicenta on the Palos Verdes Peninsula days before Christmas and before the start of the season. So it's promising to be a year when you get to see a lot of whales.

The whale watching trips last two to three hours. Group reservations at 310-548-7770 and you can find ticket information online at www.CabrilloMarineAquarium.org.

#### For Families

The SS Lane Victory is a great place to show young people about real patriotism. It's a World War II-era merchant vessel that served through the Vietnam War. And it's a working ship, providing training. It's open for tours most days (except when training or filming are taking place) and has two museums that explain the heroic history of the United States Merchant Marine, Los Angeles Harbor, and other maritime-related topics.

Much of the ship is exactly as it was during its days of service on the water and you can find out what the life of a merchant mariner was like. They suffered the greatest number of casualties by proportion of any service during World War II. SS Lane Victory is at Berth 49, 3011 Miner Street on the San Pedro Waterfront. Diving has always been popular on the island with its massive kelp forests to explore among its amazing ecosystem of natural wonders. Go snorkeling or scuba diving.


Maybe you like camping. It's a great way to get close the nature and Catalina has a variety of campgrounds all around the island.


The museum has both permanent and temporary exhibits. The facility itself is a work of art.





# Guide to Getting Around

#### Find your way around San Pedro—and all of LA.

There are lots of ways to get around.

The Historic Downtown is within walking distance of the San Pedro Waterfront or you can take the trolley on weekends.

**The Downtown Trolley** operates on weekends between the Cruise Terminal, 6th and 7th Streets, and Pacific Avenue, CRAFTED at the Port of Los Angeles, SS Lane Victory, and a stop at Battleship Iowa.

**DASH buses** operate on routes throughout the greater San Pedro area, south as far as 25th Street and west to Western Avenue.

Commuter Express line 142 has direct service to the Downtown Long Beach Transit Gallery where you can catch the Blue Line train that travels to downtown Los Angeles and connects to most rail lines that run throughout the greater Los Angeles area. Catch it at on the Waterfront or at stops along 7th Street and Gaffey Street north of 7th Street. (Note: the Blue Line is undergoing reconstruction and stops at the Rosa Parks Station. Buses are available to continue its route to Downtown Los Angeles.

**Metro Transit buses** operate several lines into, out of, and around San Pedro, mainly along 7th Street, Pacific Avenue, and Gaffey Street (although other streets are also served).

Connections to **Metrorail** are available from Downtown Los Angeles's Metro Center and some buses stop at rail stations along their routes.

The Palos Verdes Transit Authority provides bus services around the Palos Verdes Peninsula, to San Pedro, and as far north and west as Redondo Beach

#### **Metro Bike Share**

Offering bike rentals (with lots of free options). Eleven bike share stations in the Harbor area.

#### **Lime Bikes and Electric Scooters**

Look for the green bikes on many corners throughout San Pedro. Use your smartphone to unlock the bike. First ride is free.


