Here are the standouts in the region

It's no contest. These are the Best of San Pedro. These establishments qualified to become partners with Visit San Pedro. That means they offer the best products, services, and visitor experiences.

Art/Galleries/Museums

San Pedro is a town of the arts, as designated by the City of Los Angeles. It got that designation because of its great galleries and studios. San Pedro's thriving Downtown arts community shows off what it has to offer during the First Thursday Art Walk every month. And these are places throughout the San Pedro area are not to be missed whenever you visit.

It's Showtime is nearly indescribable. It is housed in the Deco Art Deco building, first built as a department store. The facility has been carefully restored and now houses the ground floor museum, the basement Speak Easy cabaret (that has an entrance recreating a classic movie palace), and the Penthouse demonstration kitchen and beautiful Pullman Room. You'll find a treasure trove of collectibles here, including ocean liner memorabilia and artifacts, medical devices, and even a Tesla coil.

Phinneas Banning is known as the father of Los Angeles Harbor. But there's more to his story than his leadership in commerce. **The Banning Museum** is a perfect representation of the years that the Banning family occupied it. Phinneas Banning was a brigadier general in the Union Army at the time of the Civil War. He built this Greek Revival mansion to show his belief that the nation would endure and remain united.

The aquarium has many exhibits and hands-on activities that explain the ecosystem of San Pedro Bay and the Pacific Ocean (and all of the ocean, too). A delightful gift shop and auditorium that hosts a range of programs. Everyone in the family will find something to love.

Did you know that Merchant Marines suffered the highest rate of casualties during World War II? Most people don't know. And that's why the **SS Lane Victory**, a living memorial to the Merchant Seamen of all eras, is living history. The ship was built in San Pedro near the close of World War II and served through the Vietnam War. It had its greatest triumphs during the Korean Conflict, when it evacuated more than 7,000 people from the approaching Communists in one voyage. See an authentic working ship that's still very much in original condition with two museums on board.

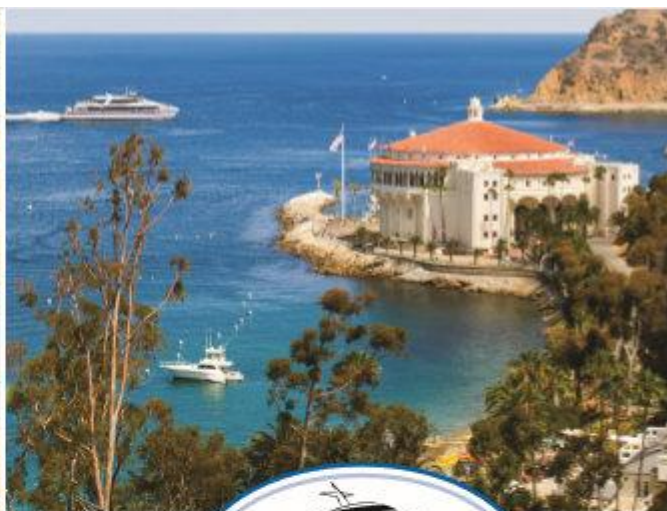

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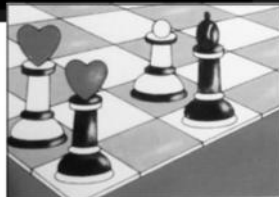

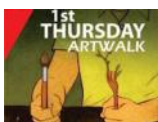

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Guide to Getting Around

Find your way around San Pedro—and all of LA.

There are lots of ways to get around.

The Historic Downtown is within walking distance of the San Pedro Waterfront or you can take the trolley on weekends.

The Downtown Trolley operates on weekends between the Cruise Terminal, 6th and 7th Streets, and Pacific Avenue, CRAFTED at the Port of Los Angeles, SS Lane Victory, and a stop at Battleship Iowa.

DASH buses operate on routes throughout the greater San Pedro area, south as far as 25th Street and west to Western Avenue.

Commuter Express line 142 has direct service to the Downtown Long Beach Transit Gallery where you can catch the Blue Line train that travels to downtown Los Angeles and connects to most rail lines that run throughout the greater Los Angeles area. Catch it at on the Waterfront or at stops along 7th Street and Gaffey Street north of 7th Street. (Note: the Blue Line is undergoing reconstruction and stops at the Rosa Parks Station. Buses are available to continue its route to Downtown Los Angeles.

Metro Transit buses operate several lines into, out of, and around San Pedro, mainly along 7th Street, Pacific Avenue, and Gaffey Street (although other streets are also served).

Connections to **Metrail** are available from Downtown Los Angeles's Metro Center and some buses stop at rail stations along their routes.

The **Palos Verdes Transit Authority** provides bus services around the Palos Verdes Peninsula, to San Pedro, and as far north and west as Redondo Beach

Metro Bike Share

Offering bike rentals (with lots of free options). Eleven bike share stations in the Harbor area.

Lime Bikes and Electric Scooters

Look for the green bikes on many corners throughout San Pedro. Use your smart-

phone to unlock the bike. First ride is free.

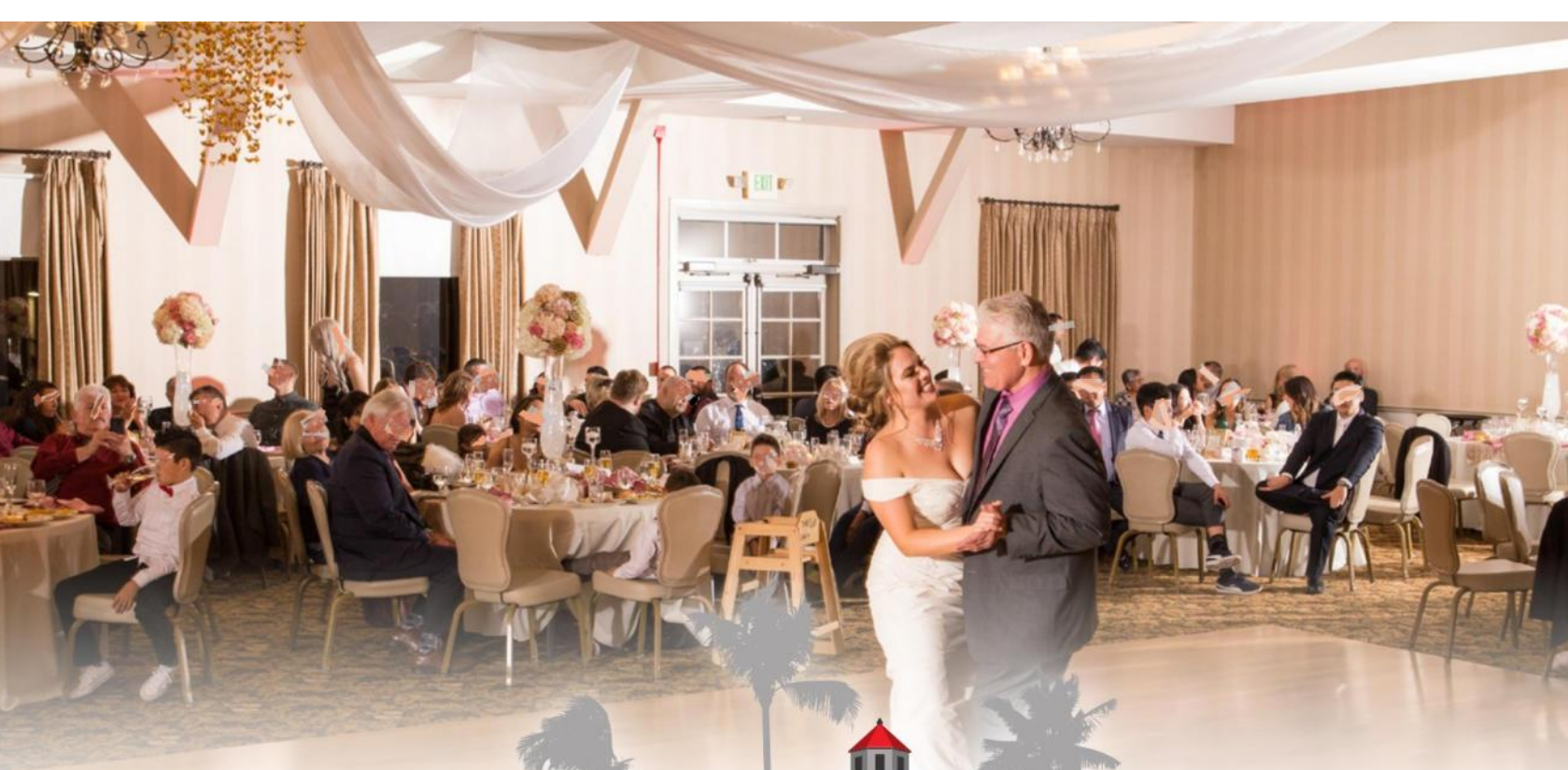
